

# **Information Sheet - Silvertown Works**

Riverlinx CJV are working on behalf of Transport for London to construct the Silvertown Tunnel.

# What are we doing?

As the main structures on the Silvertown Tunnel site near completion, fit out and utility works ramp up on all areas of site with the extensive installation of ducting and pipes. This is to facilitate all the mechanical and electrical services required to power the tunnel for operation in 2025. Changes to road layouts are ongoing to connect the tunnel to the existing network. # Blackwall Tunnel (A102) weekend closures (Southbound)

To facilitate the resurfacing works on the northbound Blackwall Tunnel approach, the southbound carriageway will be closed during the following weekends:

#### From 00:01 Saturday 23 March to Monday 25 March 05:00

From 00:01 Saturday 06 April to Monday 08 April 05:00 (a contingency weekend if the previous weekend is not possible)

#### From 00:01 Saturday 13 April to Monday 15 April 05:00

#### Lower Lea Crossing

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In January the traffic management was altered to divert pedestrians, cyclists and vehicles away from the site. This has allowed works to continue inside the site boundary where changes are being made to the Tidal Basin Roundabout which will connect the new road layout to the tunnel entrance. In May, traffic management will alter again signposting vehicles and cyclists to circumnavigate the new and old roundabouts. This will enable the final phase of the roundabout transformation to be built which will see a new pedestrian route being constructed through the old roundabout. See fig. 2 overleaf.

# 'Cut and Cover' Tunnel

Inside the 'cut and cover' section of tunnel, services are starting to be installed on the roof structure, see fig. 3. Simultaneously, above the tunnel domes, waterproofing works (see fig.4) have been completed to protect the structure and concrete mass fill above the vault has been poured, ready to start soil backfilling.

# Tunnel approach – 'Open Cut'

The external walls of the tunnel approach are now complete, see fig.4 below. As soon as the team has finished in April, the utility specialists will prepare to lay ducts and pipes within the structure.

- Core hours: Mondays to Fridays: 08:00 - 18:00; Saturdays: 08:00 -13:00
